

<u>Congress Theme</u>: Diversity in Harmony:

Insights from Psychology In today's world, diversity in our world can be seen as both problematic and beneficial. Diversity is related to ethnicity and culture, as well as physical attributes and health. There is also diversity among the various domains of the field of psychology. The term 'harmony' is derived from Greek words meaning "joint, agreement, concord" and "to fit together, to join," and is most often used in music to indicate different tones that make a pleasing or striking sound when played together. This concept of "living together," i.e., of many diverse constituent parts coexisting in accord, forms the basis of ICP2016.



Final Call for Abstract Submissions

The abstract submission site of ICP2016 will close on January 15, 2016. This is the final call for abstract submissions for oral and poster presentations, contributed and invited speakers. The scheduling allows no flexibility and we will not postpone the deadline again. Those interested in oral and poster presentations should submit abstracts through the <u>Registration & Abstract Submission</u> page by January, 15, 2016 (no later than 24:00 Japan Standard Time).
