## PRESENTERS BRIEF BIOGRAPHIES

Pam Maras is President of the International Union of Psychological Science (IUPsyS) and Professor of Social and Educational Psychology at the University of Greenwich, London. Her research is in social psychological factors underpinning and affecting children and young people's attitudes, behaviour and motivation, and the impact of perceptions and associated behaviours on outcomes for young people. She has attracted considerable personal research funding and has international research collaborations in Africa, Australasia, China, Europe, Nordic countries, North and Latin America, and Asia. Professor Maras has significant international leadership experience in capacity building and is committed to understanding the complexities and tensions of an increasingly globalising unequal world and local involvement in setting research agendas. She is often asked to comment to media, and to government, local authorities, schools and charities. Pam has provided parliamentary evidence, including to the UK Ministerial Stakeholders' Group on Pupil Behaviour and Discipline, and invited oral evidence to the House of Commons Education Committee on Behaviour and Discipline in Schools.



Abigail Gewirtz is the Editor-in-Chief to the International Journal of Psychology, and Lindahl Leadership Faculty Chair in the Department of Family Social Science and the Institute of Child Development, at the University of Minnesota. Her research focuses on the development, effectiveness testing, and widespread implementation of targeted prevention programs that promote child resilience among highly stressed families including those affected by military deployment, and war. For over 15 years, Dr. Gewirtz's research has been funded by the US National Institutes of Health, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, and the Department of Defence. She is Principal Investigator on two current RCTs of the ADAPT military parenting program, and two implementation grants. She is also the author of When the World Feels Like a Scary Place: Essential Conversations for Anxious Parents and Worried Kids (Workman Press, June 2020).



Martin Obschonka is a Psychologist working in the research fields of applied psychology, entrepreneurship, vocational behaviour, economic culture, and social, economic, and technological change. He is currently Director of the Australian Centre for Entrepreneurship Research and Full Professor in the QUT Business School, Queensland University of Technology, Brisbane, Australia. With his focus on person-environment interactions and transaction, his research aims at advancing the knowledge of psychological and economic factors and mechanisms relevant for human agency in context. His research involves projects on entrepreneurial development over the lifespan, entrepreneurial regions and culture, public policy, human capital, personality, geographical psychology, organisational behaviour, well-being and stress, and social and economic change.



Liqi Zhu is a Professor at the *Institute of Psychology*, Chinese Academy of Sciences, China. Her research focuses on children's cognitive development and social behaviour. She is an Associate Editor of *International Journal of Psychology* and was an Associate Editor of Child Development. Professor Zhu is also the regional coordinator and Executive Committee Member of the International Society for the Study of Behavioural Development (ISSBD). She chaired the jury for the IUPsyS 2016 Young Investigator Awards .
